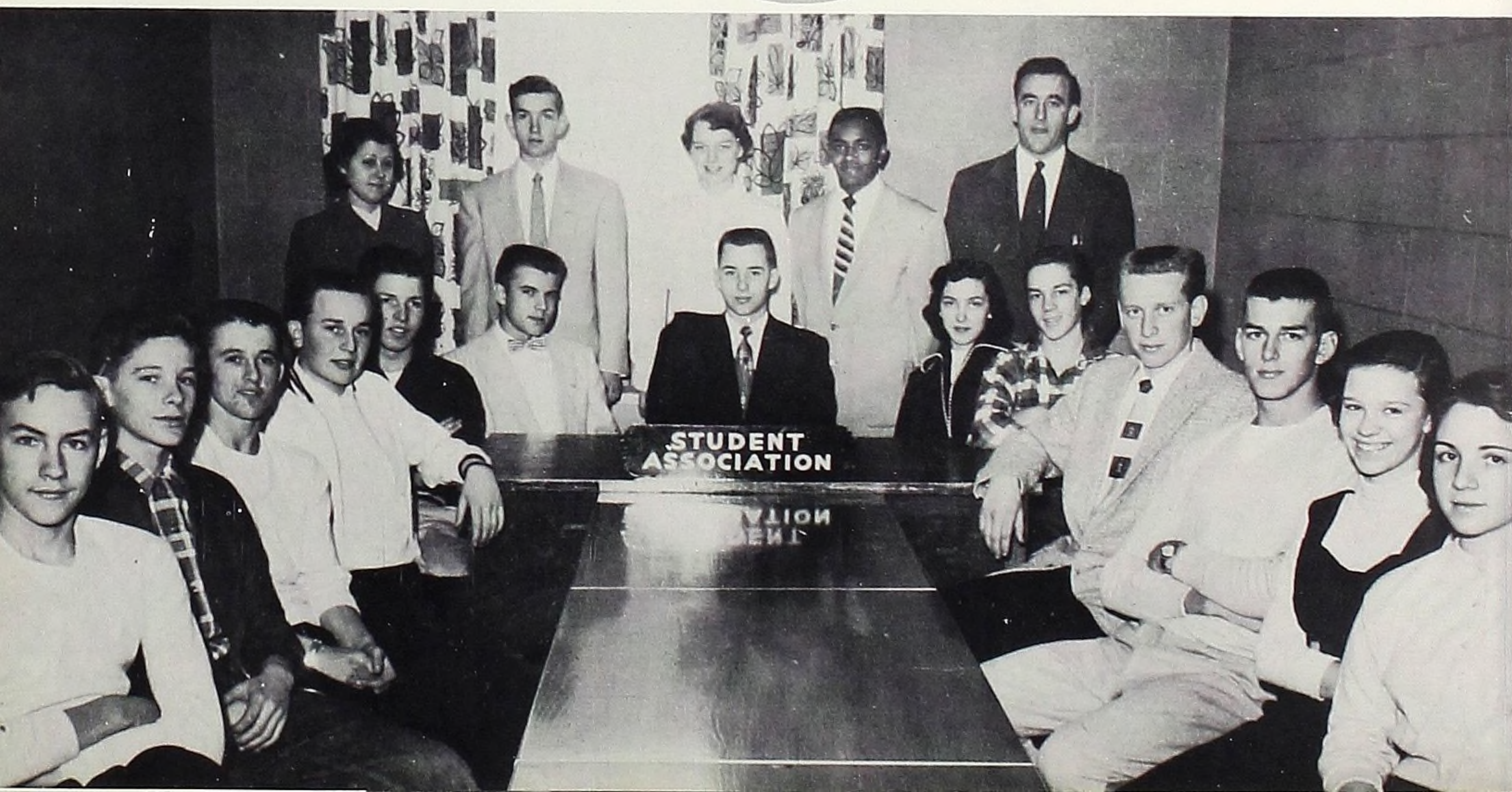




STUDENT COUNCIL

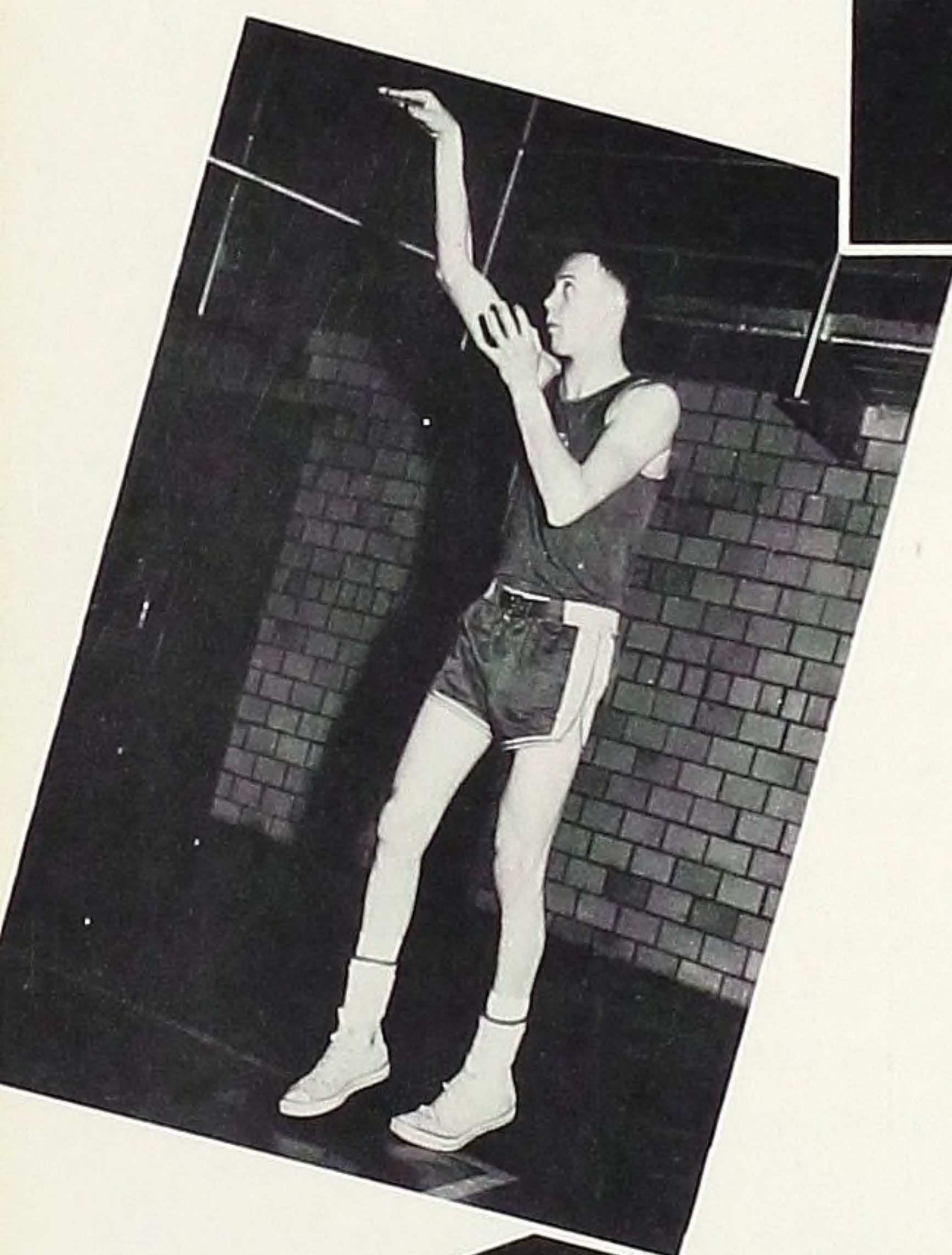
HIGH SCHOOL TRACK

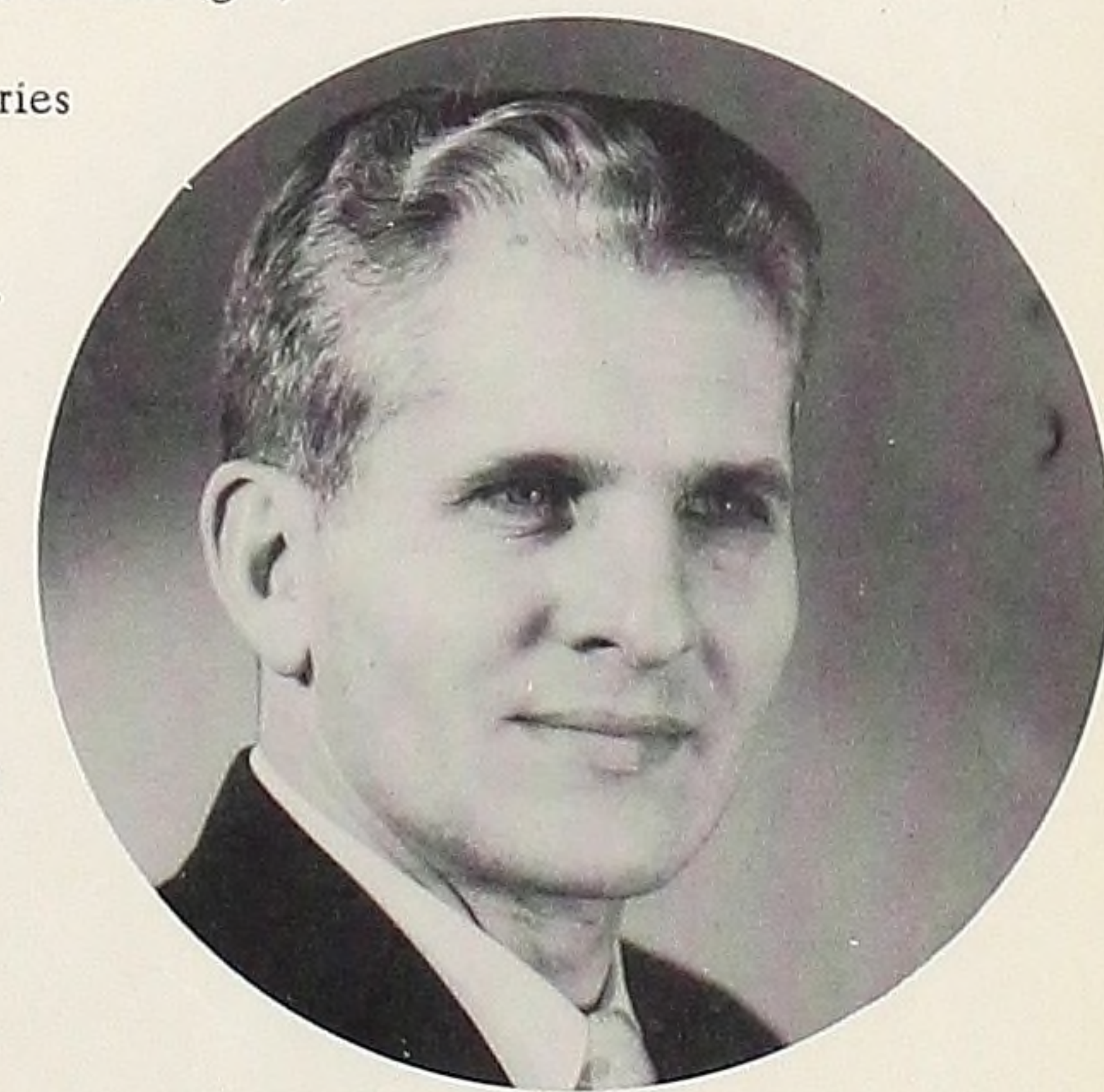
College Basketball
