It is the goal of the Redit Staff to inform the student body of all the past events, as well as hint as to what's in view.

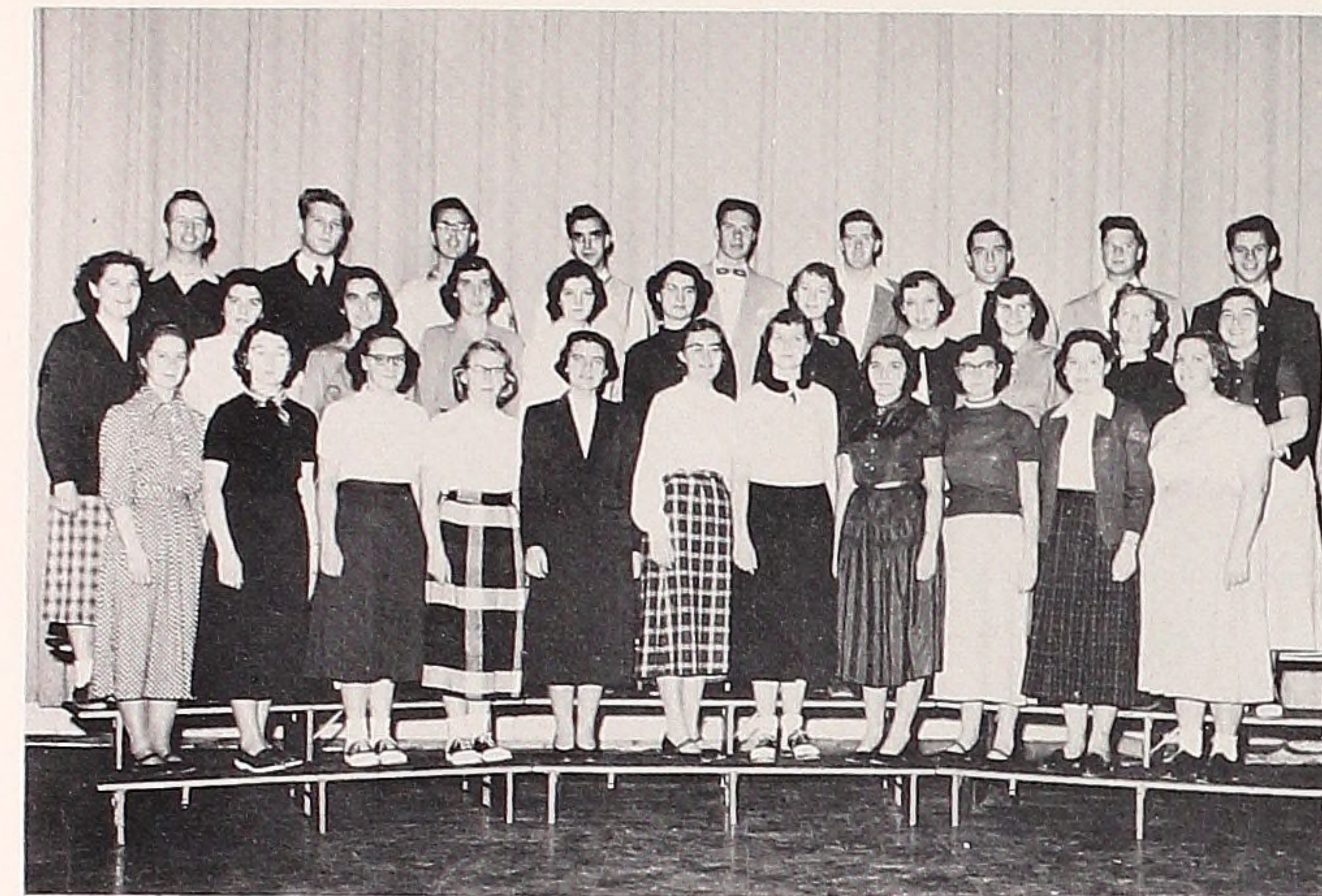

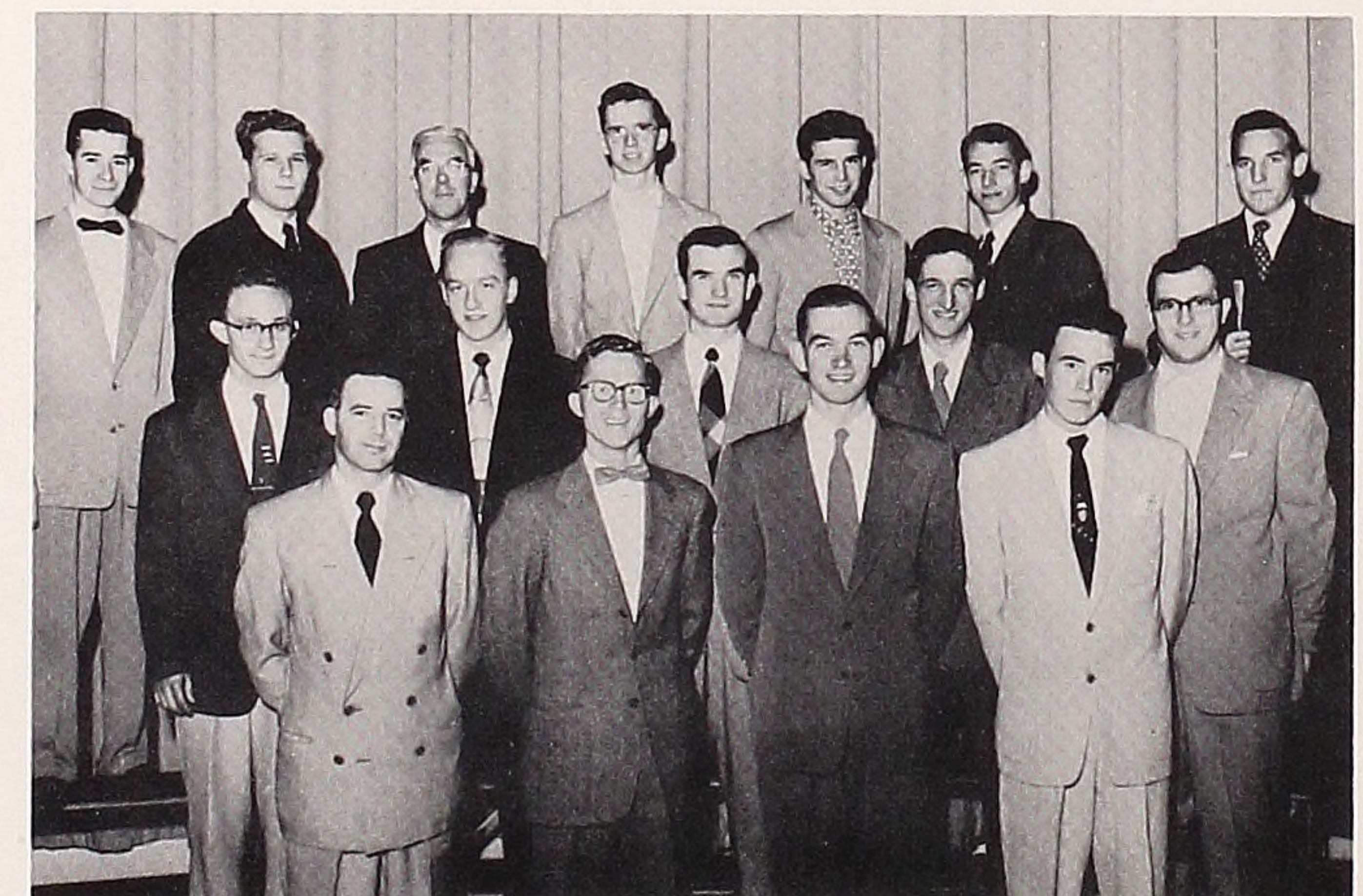
GAVEL POUNDERS

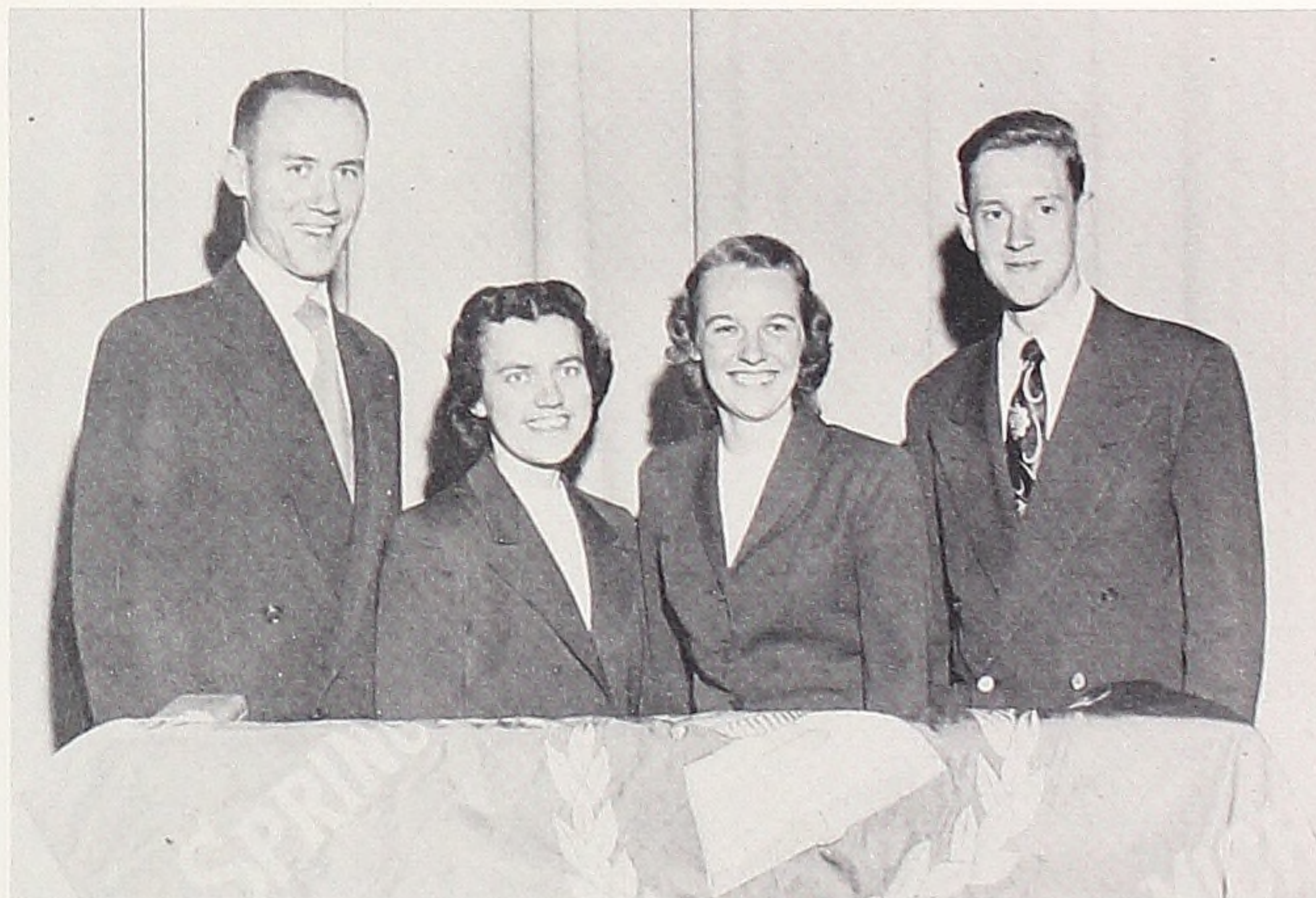


SECOND CHOIR

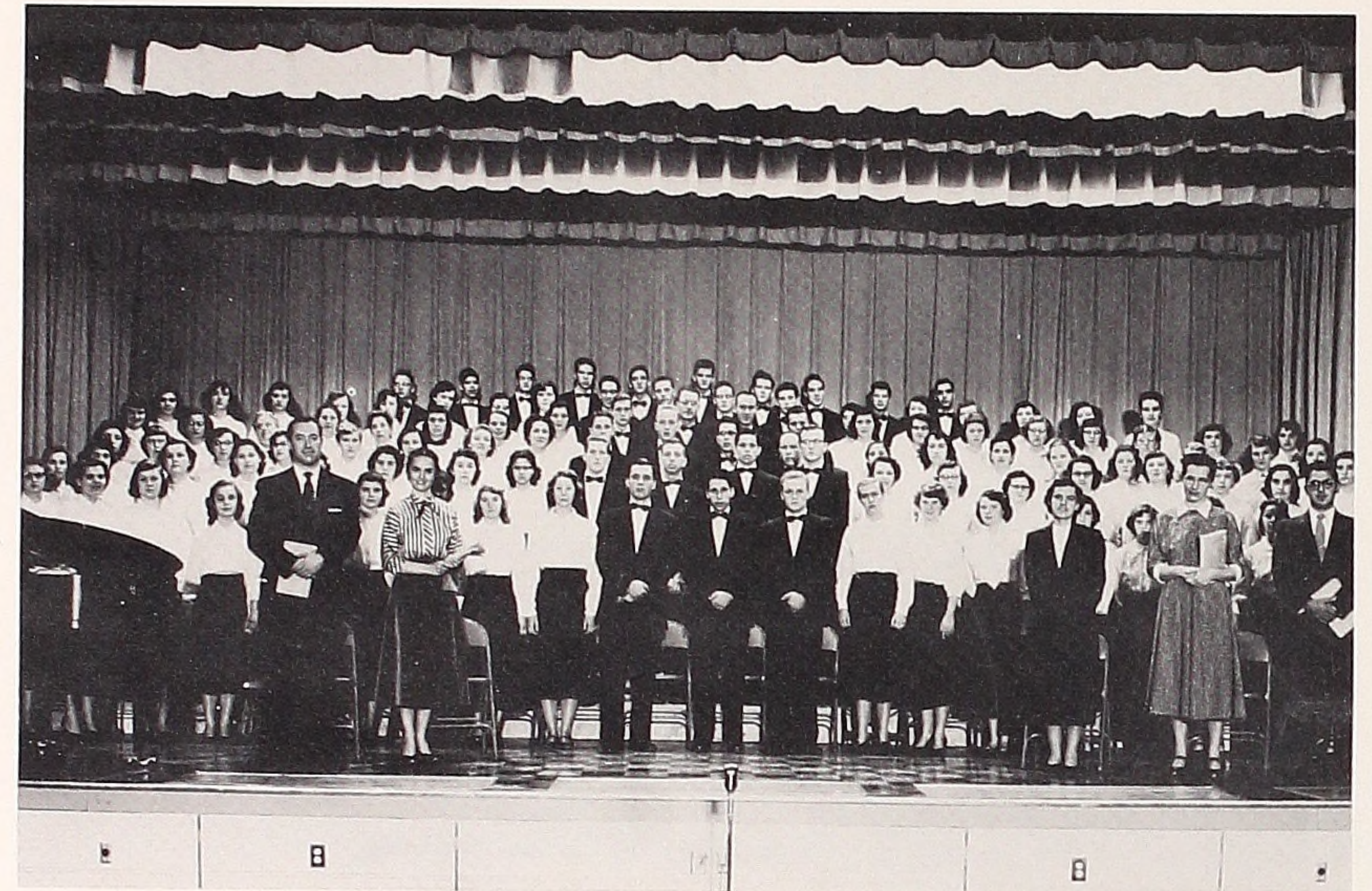
Under the direction of Miss Vera Lindsey, this organization is composed of students who enjoy singing. During the year they sang for Chapel services and gave a Spring concert.

A CAPPELLA CHOIR OF 1929

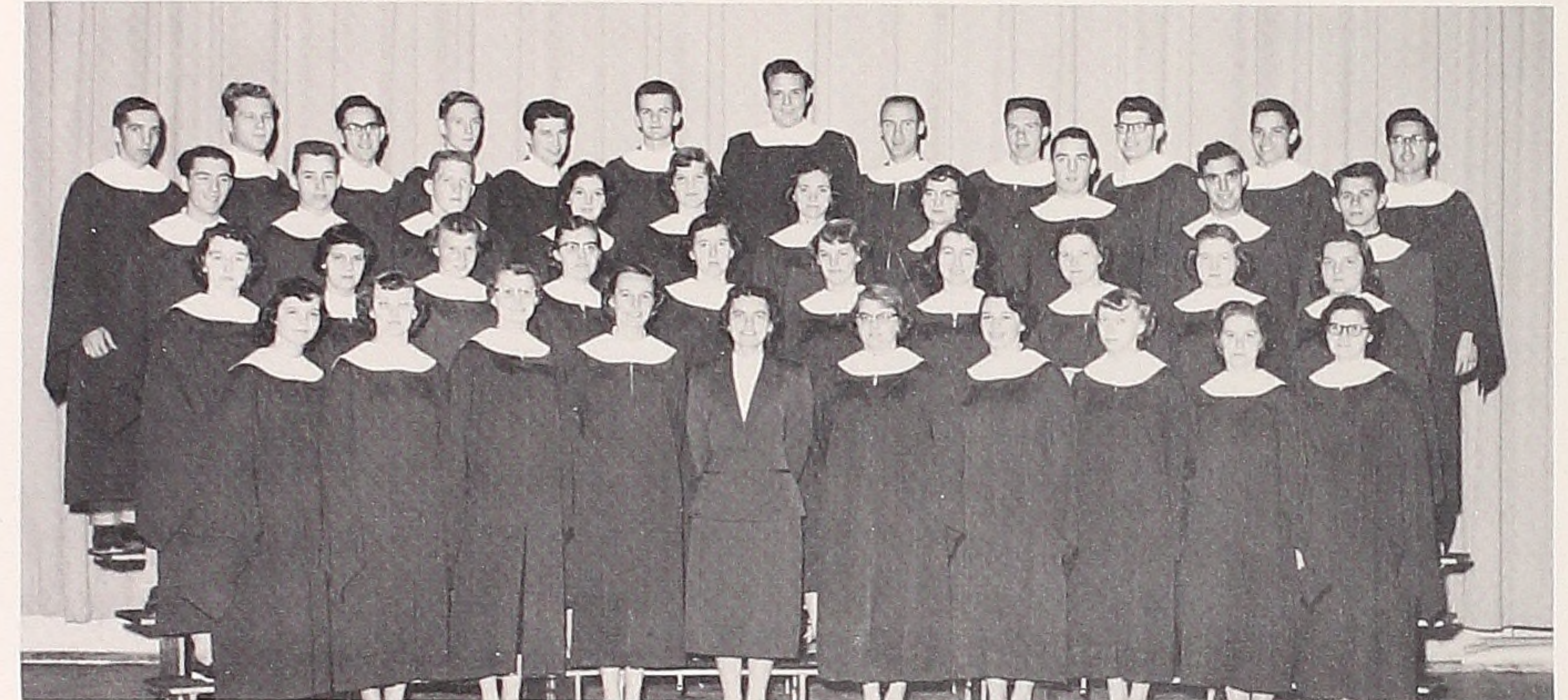

It is a fond memory with lasting effects.

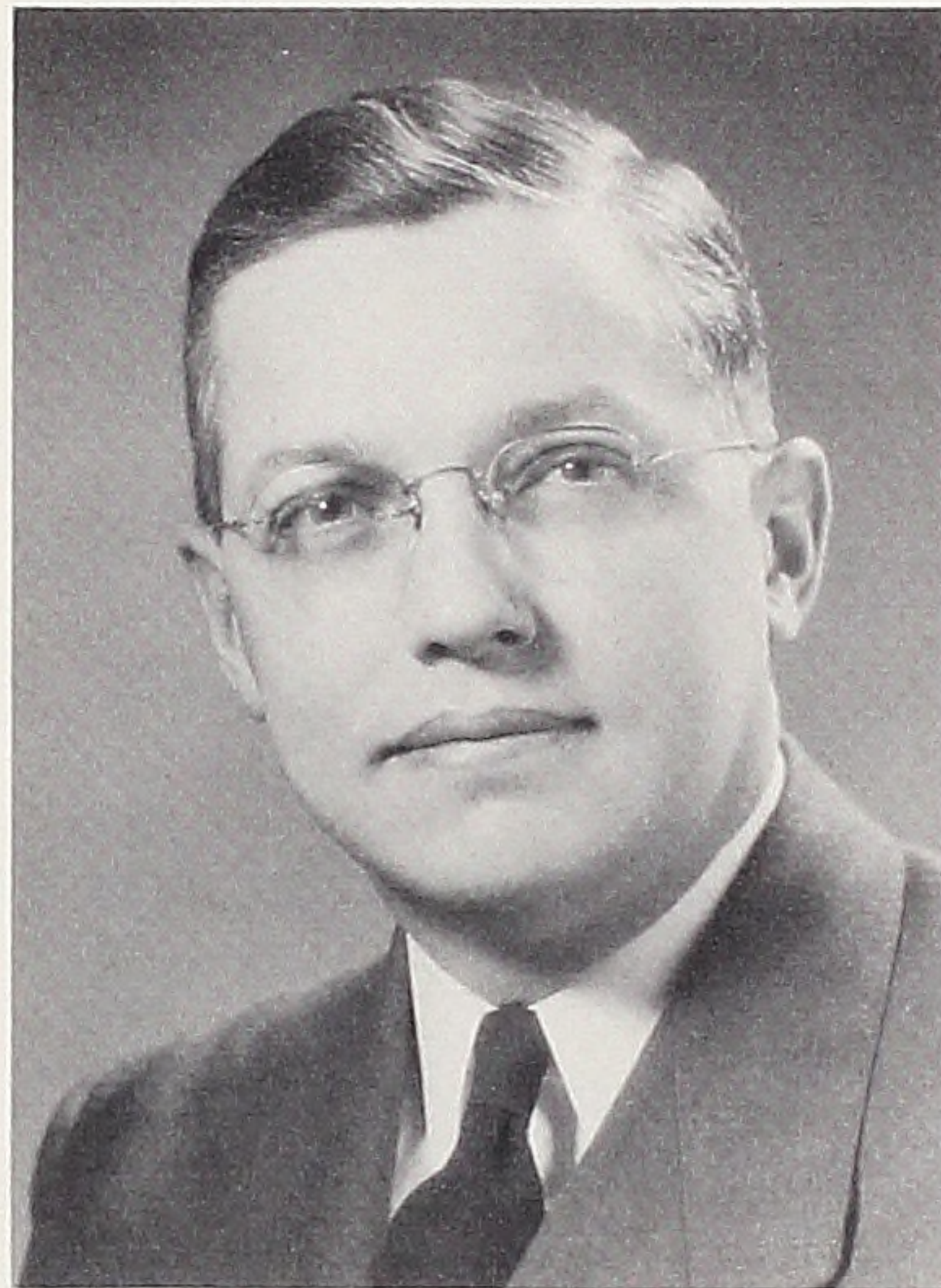
A CAPPELLA CHORUS—1954
