In Memoriam




Rev. W. C. Muffitt, a patriarch of Free Methodism, died September 18, 1949, as a result of injuries received when struck by an automobile on his return home from evening service at the Spring Arbor college church. He served for fifty years as pastor and Elder in the Michigan and Ohio Conferences.

Long a friend of Spring Arbor, he endeared himself to the hearts of hundreds of students who knew him. Through his own personal finances he made it possible for sixty-eight girls to attend our school. His fifty-two years of service on the Board of Trustees at Spring Arbor is an outstanding testimonial of his vital interest in youth.


We shall miss this man of God, whose holy life has mirrored humility, integrity, and faith. Truly a prince with God and a prince among men has gone to his reward.
