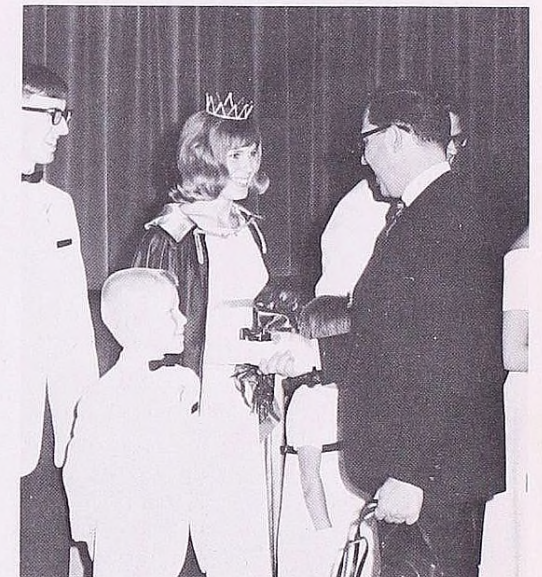

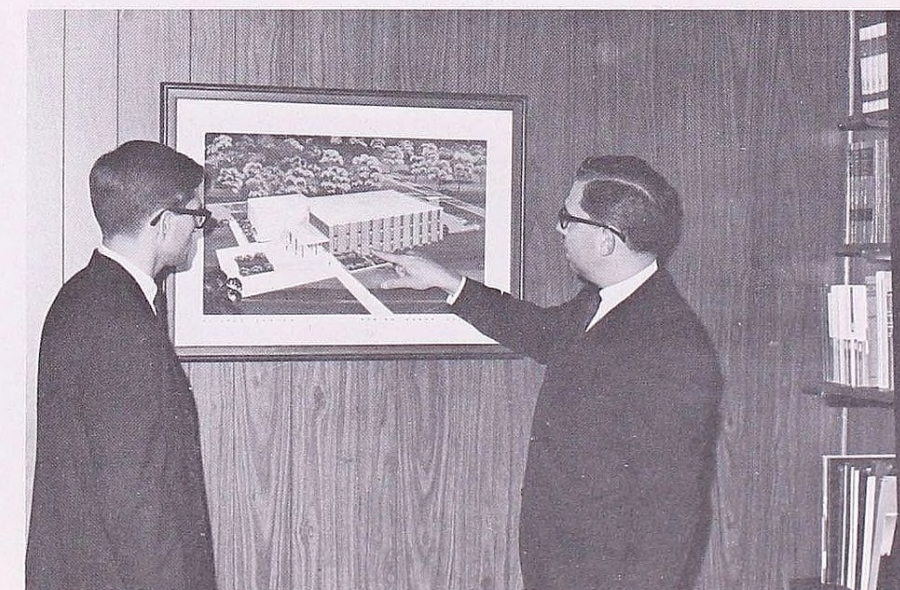

Fellowship Sets Plans

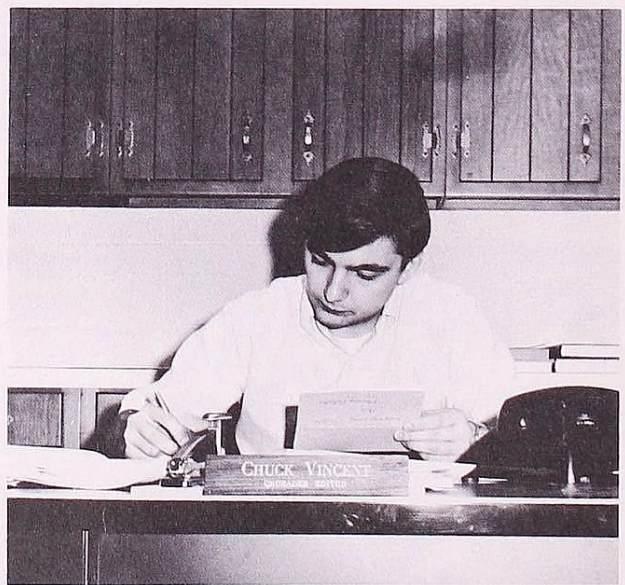

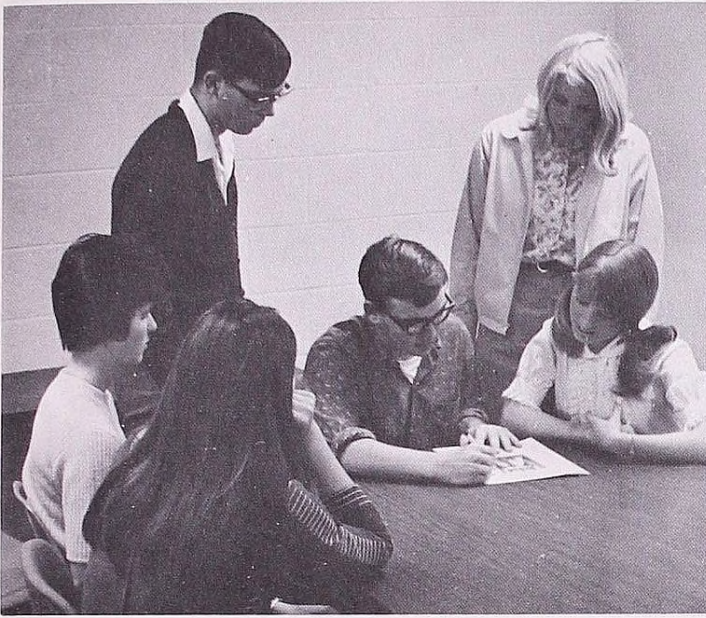

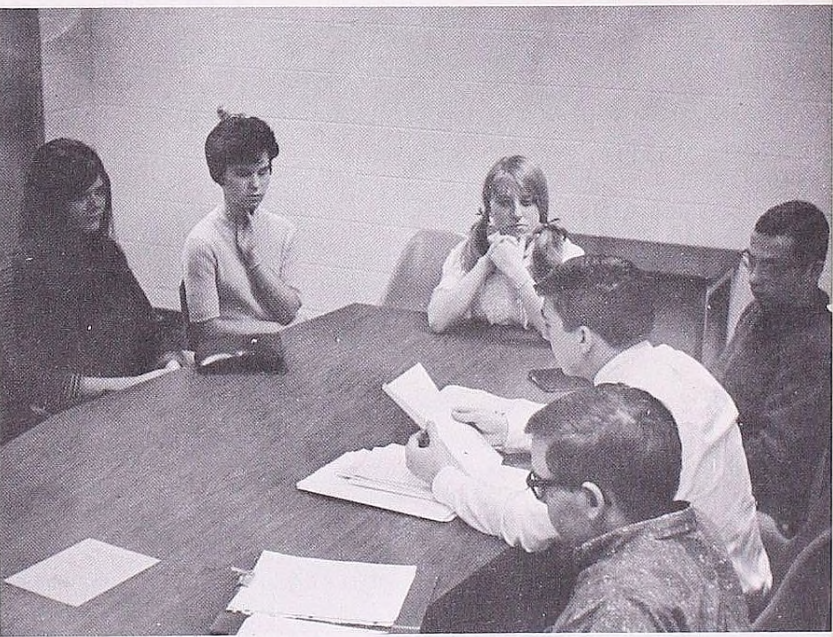
The President's Corner

In the past, Student Council has been hampered by small, inadequate, and inconvenient office facilities, a fact which not only limited its efficiency but suffocated its contact with the student body as a whole. However, the most finicky could hardly find cause for complaint with the new Student Council offices in the Student Center. Carpeted, comfortable, and well-equipped, the offices are in an ideal location (on your left as you go up the stairway to the Dining Commons). The new facilities have already proved to be a tremendous asset in stimulating activity, efficiency, and unity among the Student Council officers. But even more important, I hope that you will feel free to drop by any time to air a gripe or suggestions and to feel a part of your Student Council, for only as we know your needs and ideas can we act to meet and implement them.

Although we would regret to see the time come when lack of what someone considers proper respect can cause a stoppage in maintenance services, we can see the point of view of those charged with this responsibility. We suggest that it is a problem met with action by all concerned.

Campus Council: Idealistic or realistic rather than continued idealism and unauthorized on a year basis. The Campus Council should in addition to a means for checking itself, a power to demand action from the Student Council Faculty. Perhaps a situation could be arranged wherein Campus Council could set a deadline for recommendations to be acted upon perhaps one month after its making made the proposal. Another matter of importance concerns the power of student or faculty chairs of faculty-student committees. As these committees exist presently, the faculty chairman is in charge of all meetings with the student chairman taking over only at the faculty chairman's request. However, I would suggest that the chair of all committees alternate between the faculty and student chairmen, as it does between Dr. McKenna and me. To consider and rectify the whole Campus Council.



However, the pragmatism with which Campus Council has been run has often turned into sloppiness and confusion concerning structure and roles. Although Campus Council is a recommending rather than an acting body, it should have a small but significant degree of autonomy. For example, it should have a definite procedure for change in its structure; i.e., a provision that is archaic "dead wood" should not be merely ignored but removed, and a committee such as Academic Affairs or Food Services which can be functional should be permanently authorized. Lack of organization seems to be the cause for the failure. I comment to this point emphasizing the fact that activity was getting toward sports and that neither women students nor the intercollegiate athletes could participate freely. Several suggestions were given for realizing better organization: few thought that the whole idea was too large for just one committee and that several committees should be at work. Some suggested ice-breakers and other types of acquainted games should be organized. Obvious to all was that other than athletic activities should be considered.

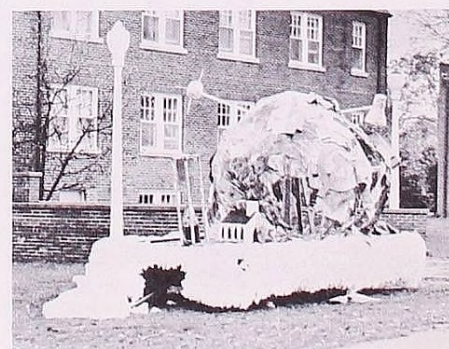
