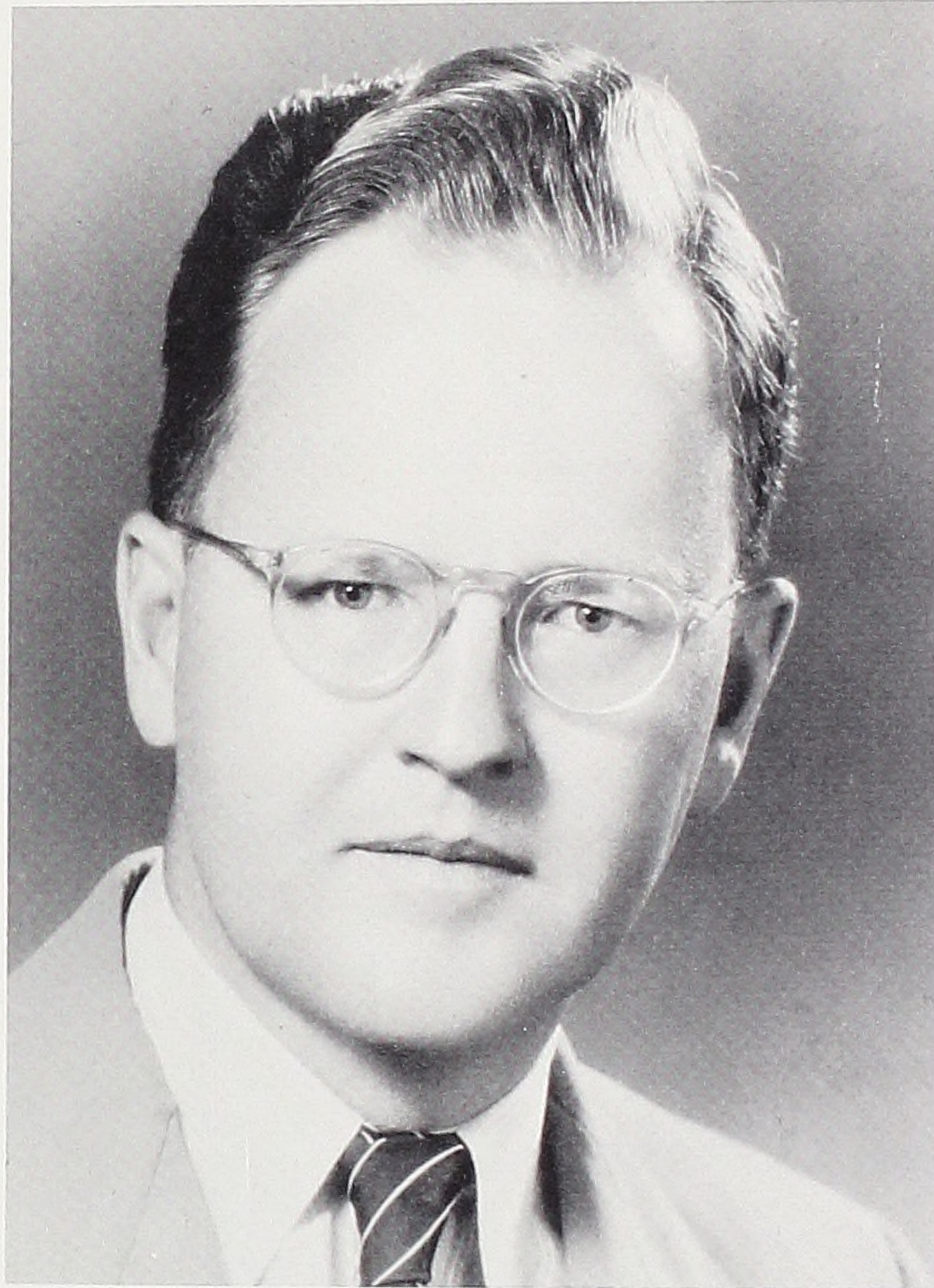


In Memoriam

You have seen and will participate in epochal events. You and I must pray and believe that these troublesome times are but the prelude to a better era for mankind.

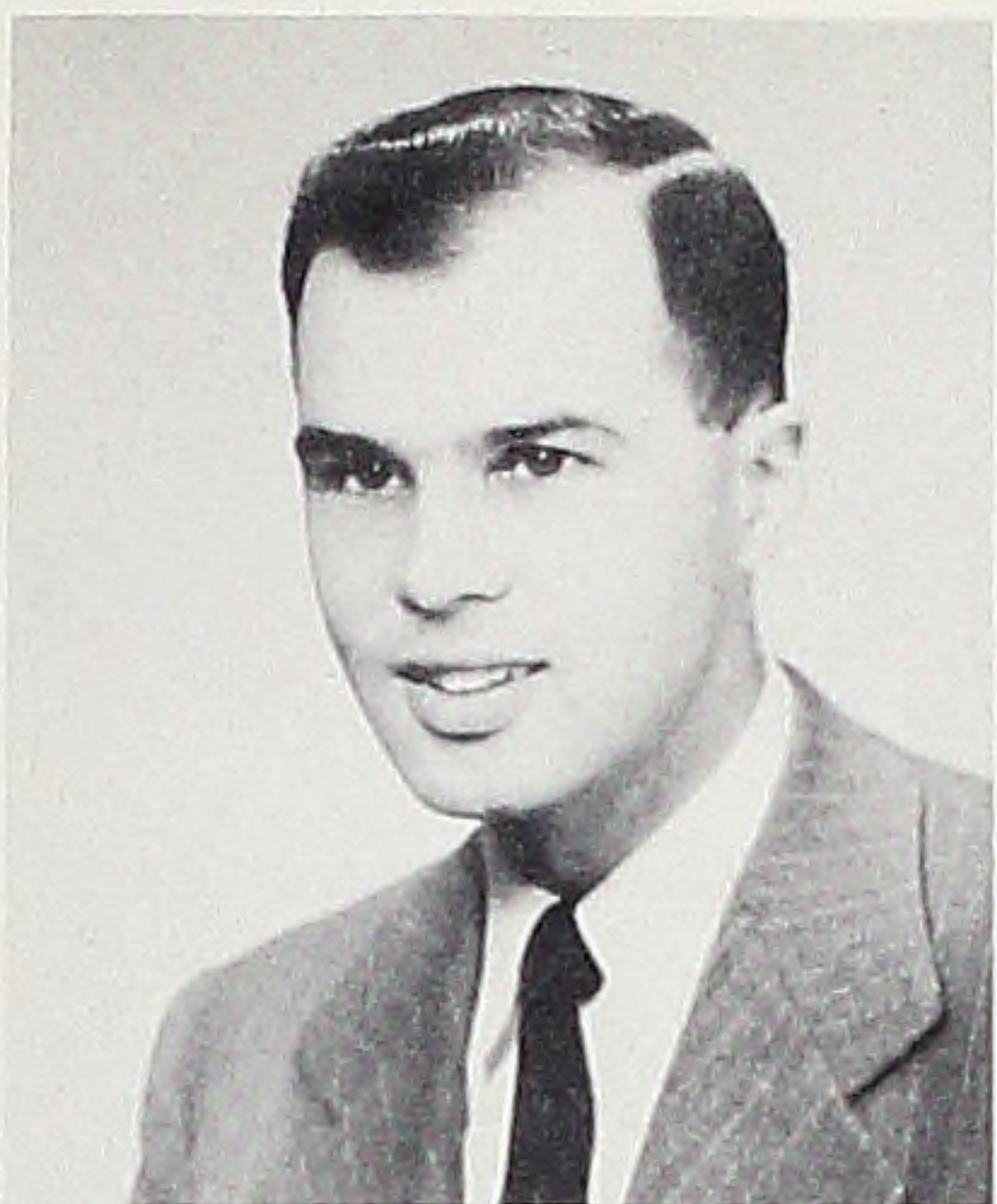

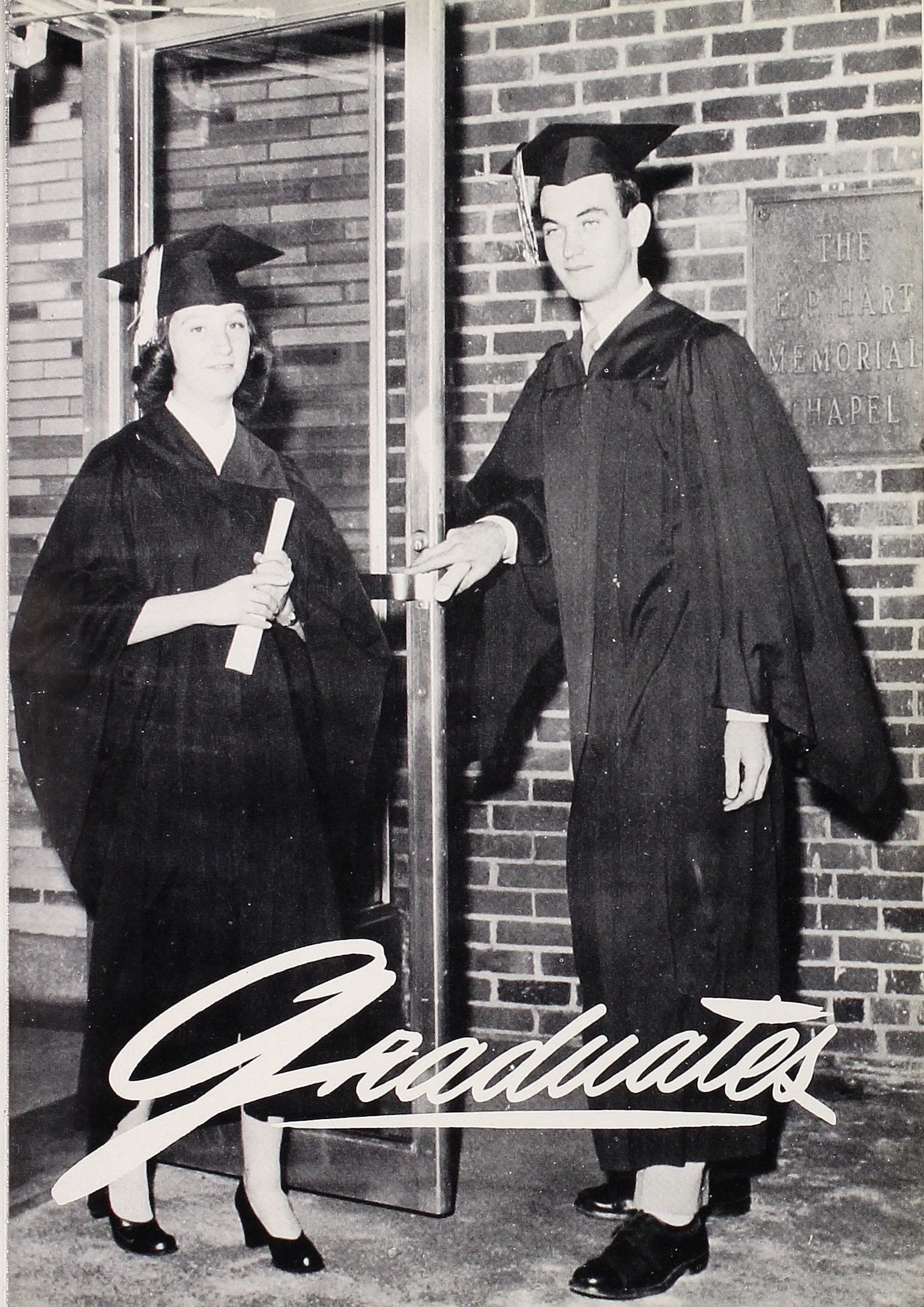
The College Church

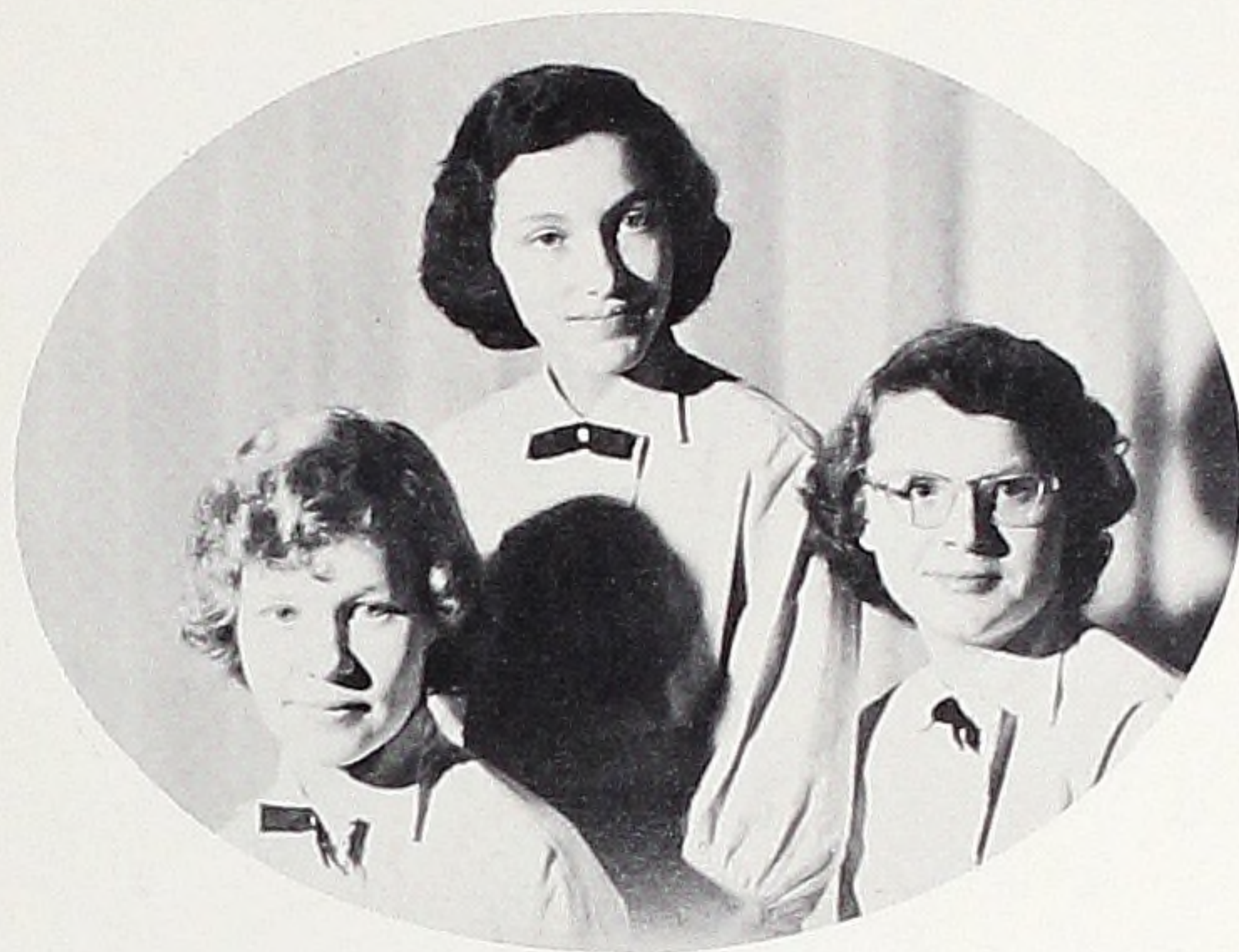
CRUSADE ENSEMBLE

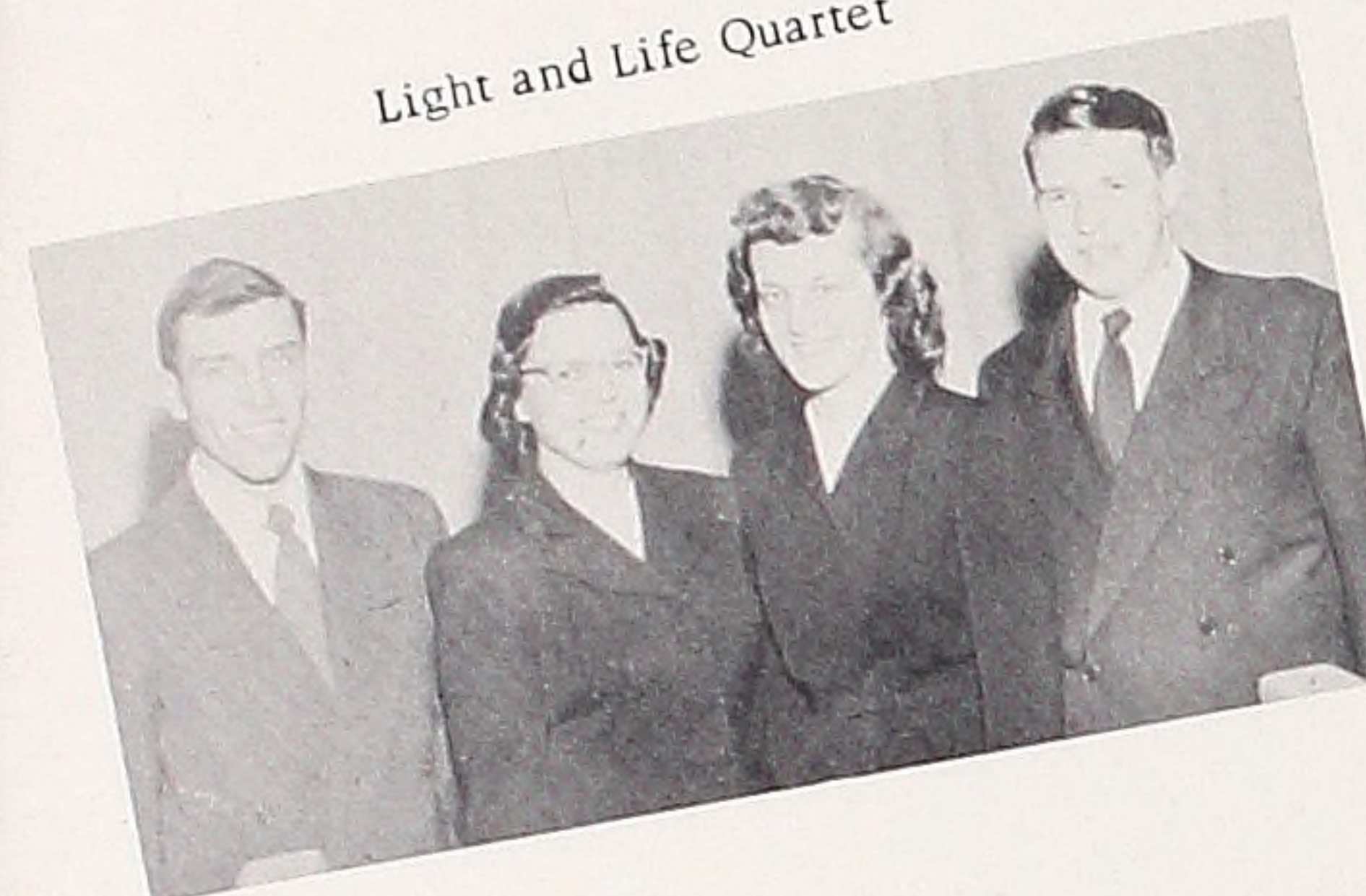

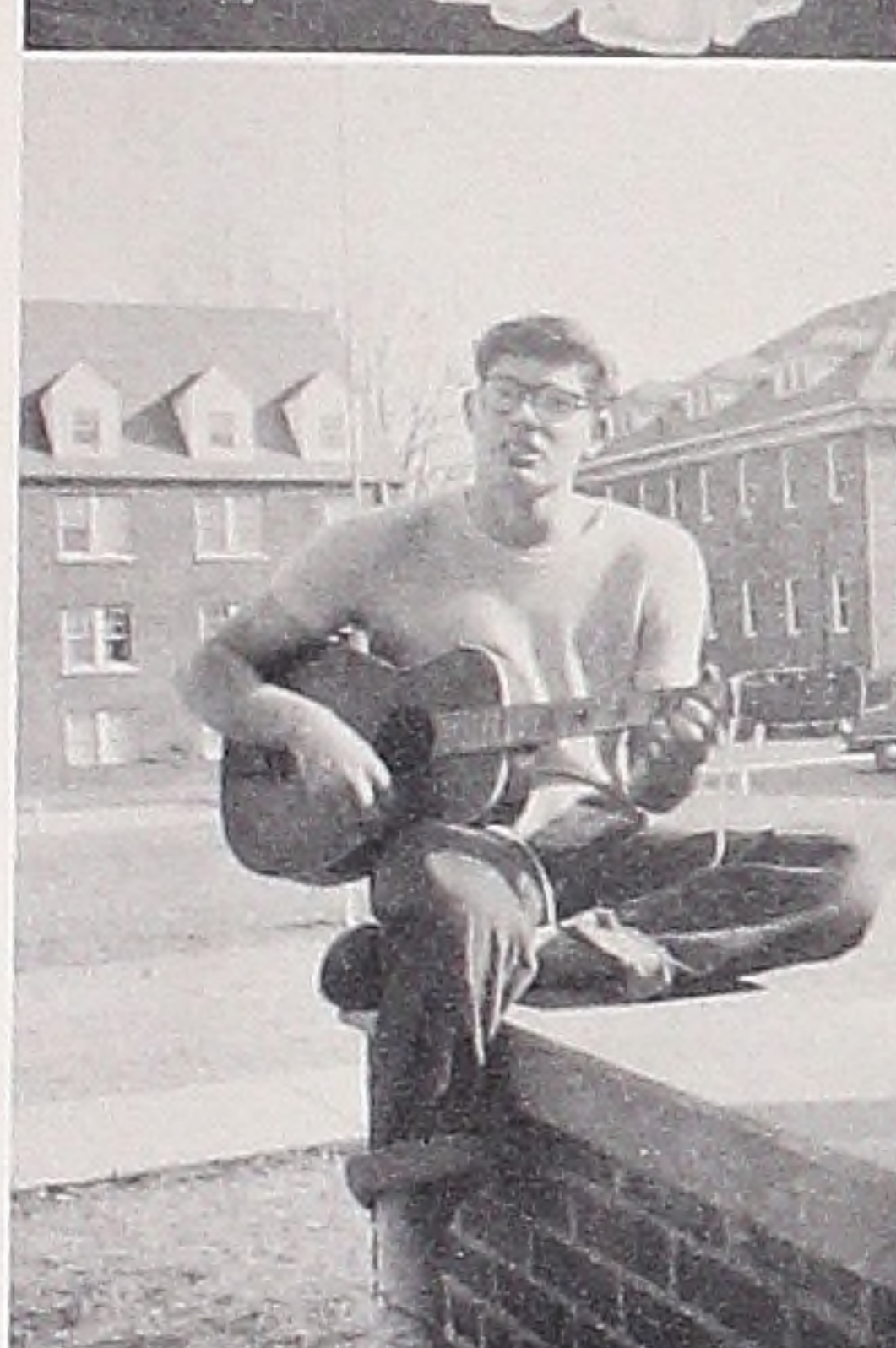
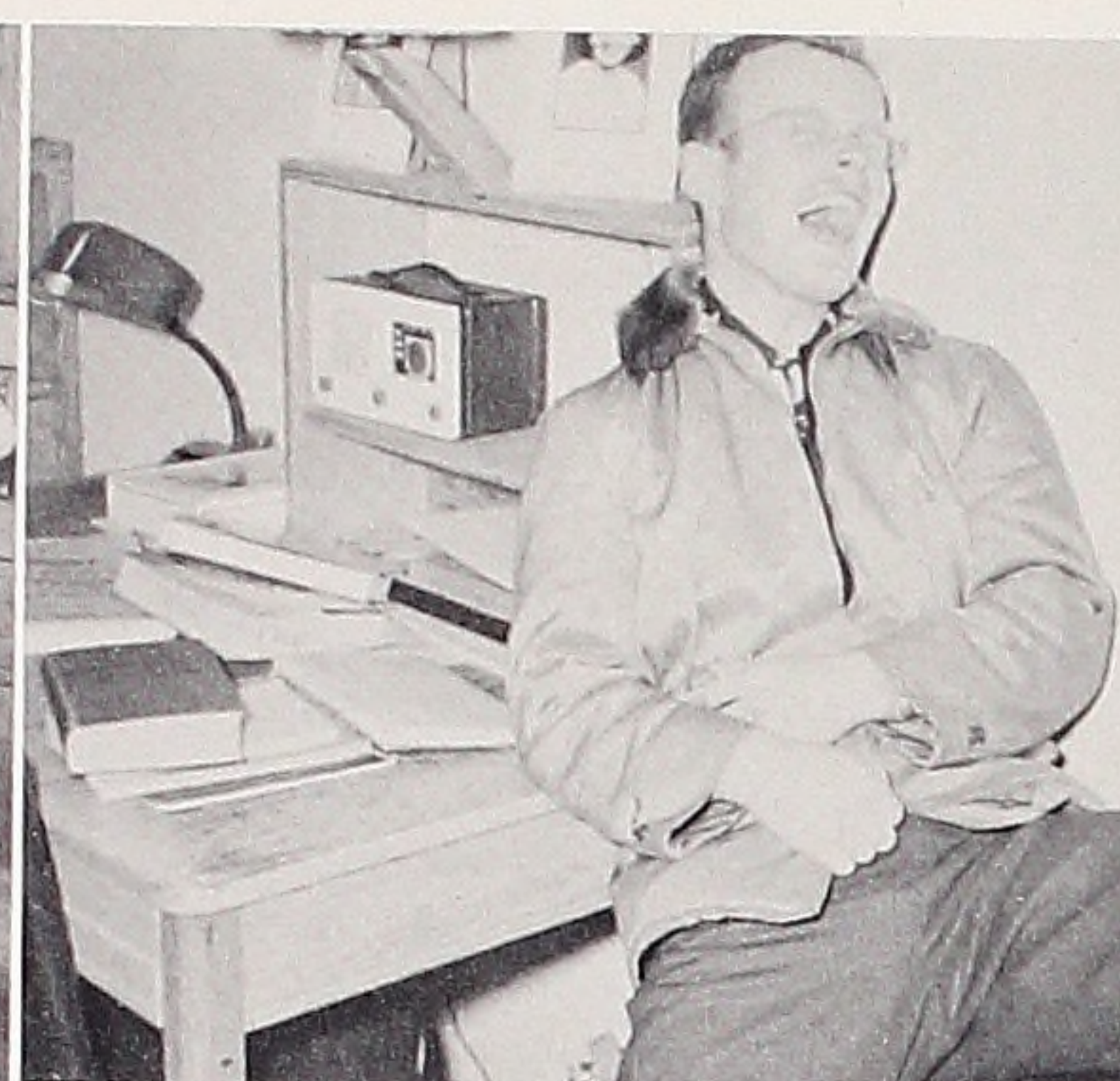
BRAZIL for Christ CRUSADE
