Juniors

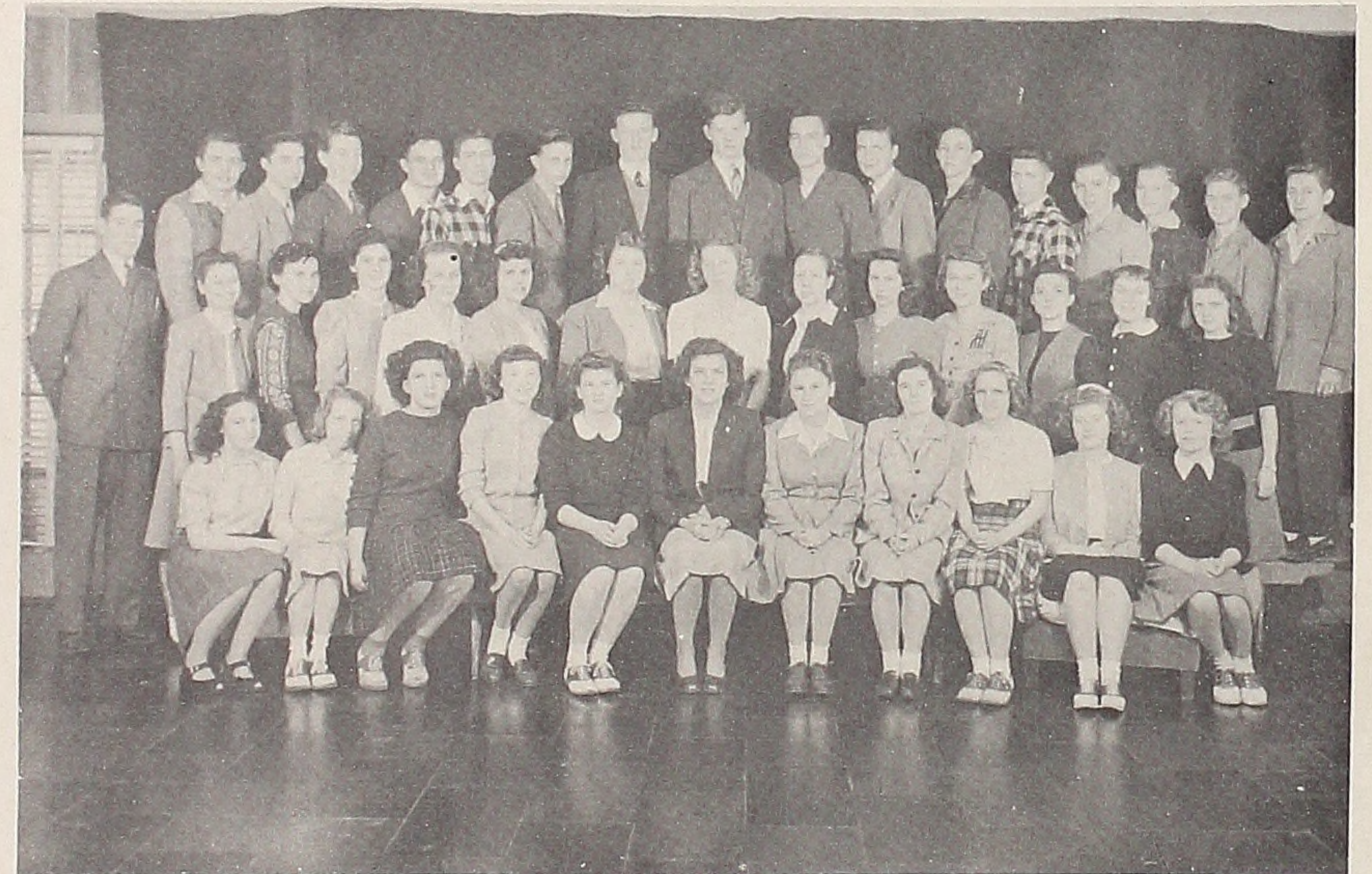
We have climbed the stairway of success up to the Junior landing.

We Freshies are just beginning to ascend the steps of the stairway which will lead us to our Senior year and graduation.

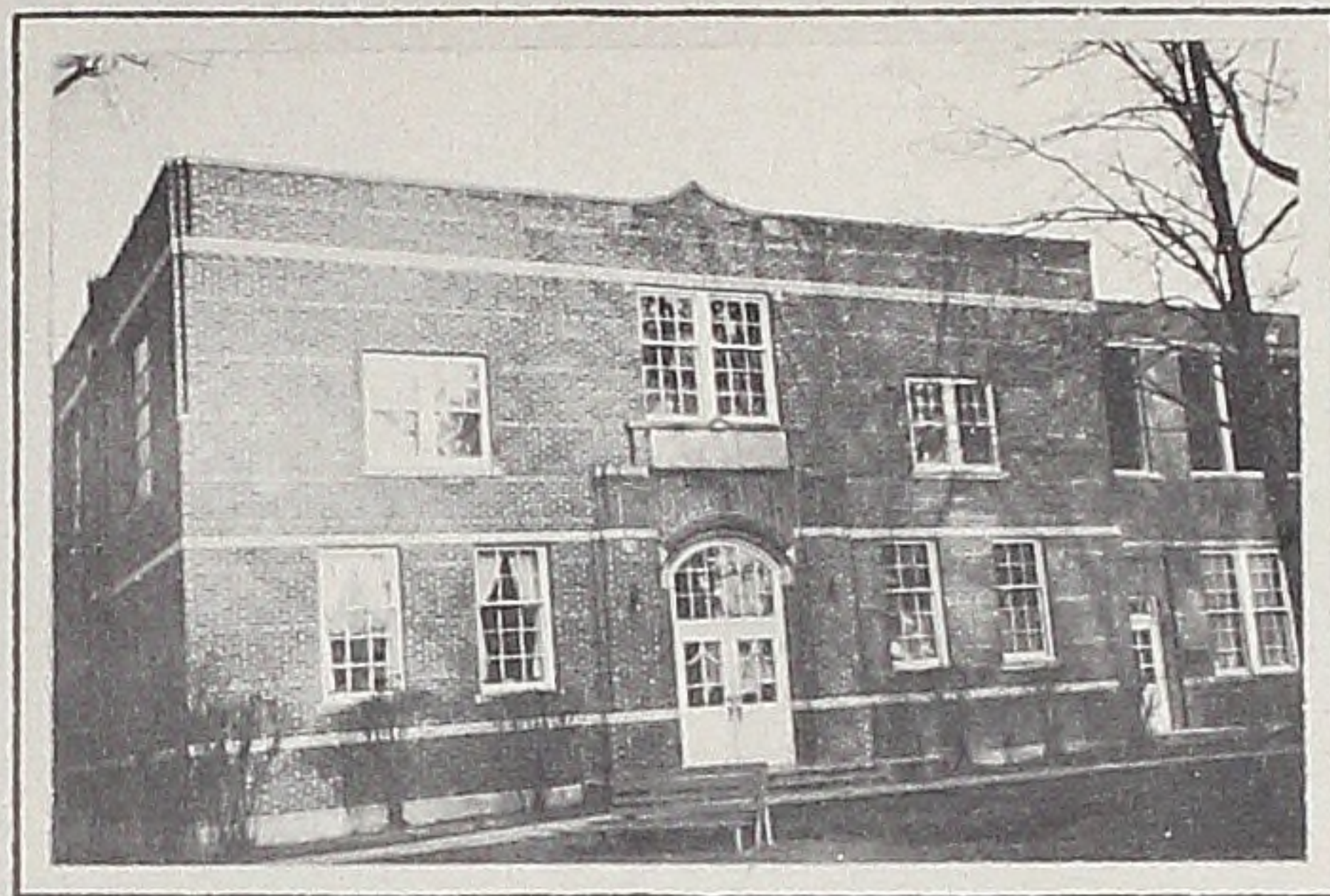

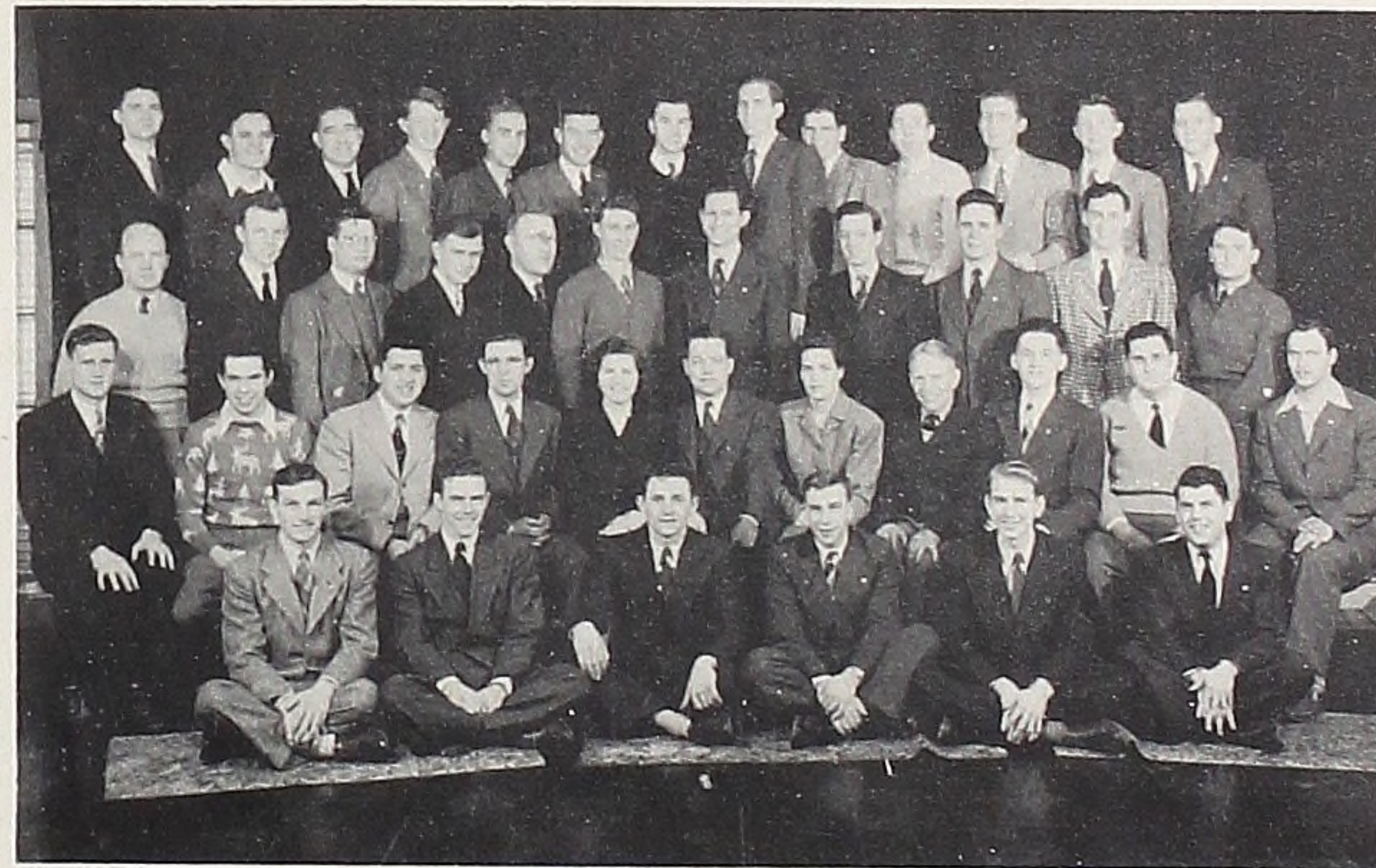
This year the A Cappella went on a ten day concert tour through southern Michigan and Ohio.

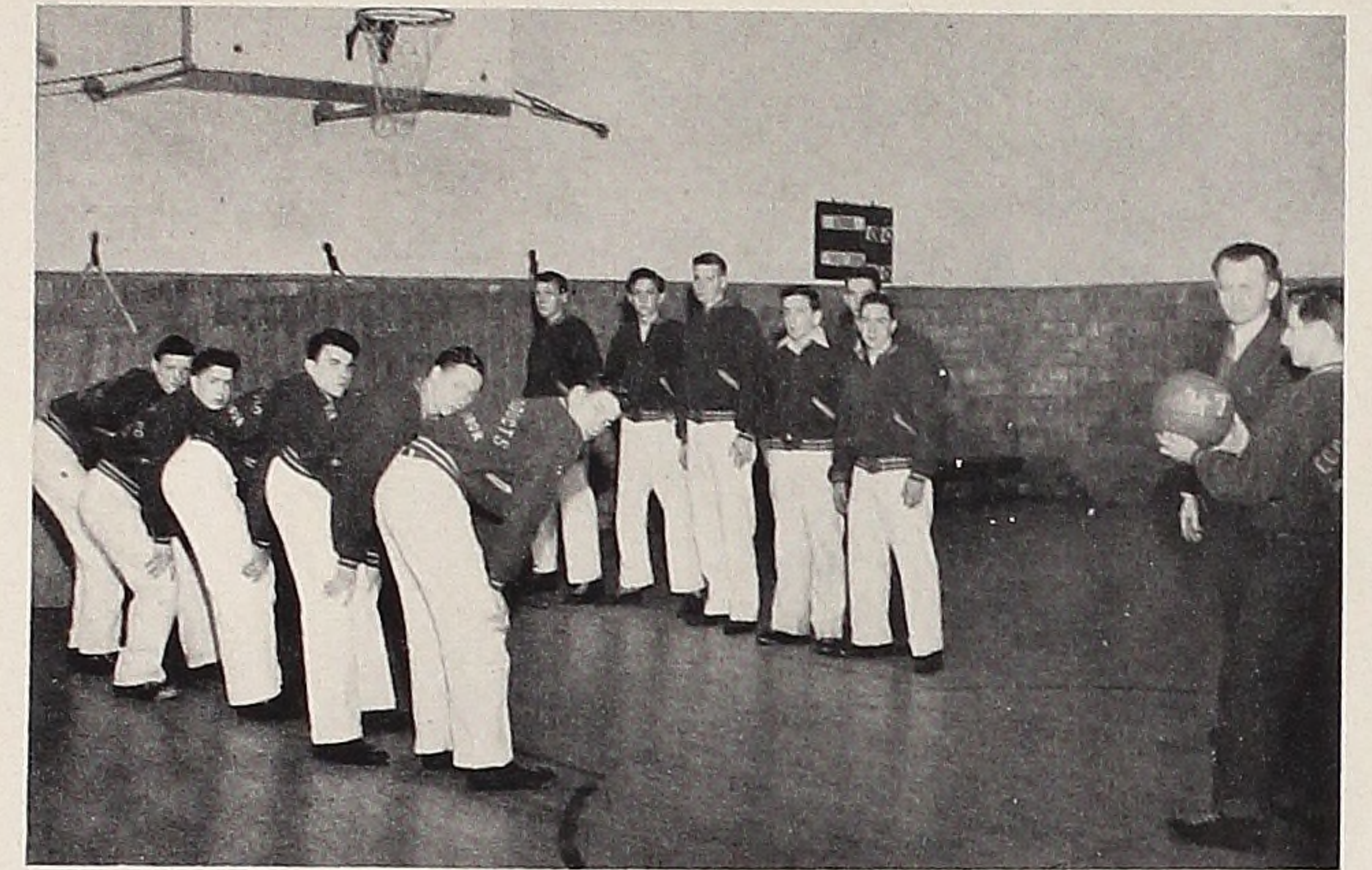
Chatterbox Club

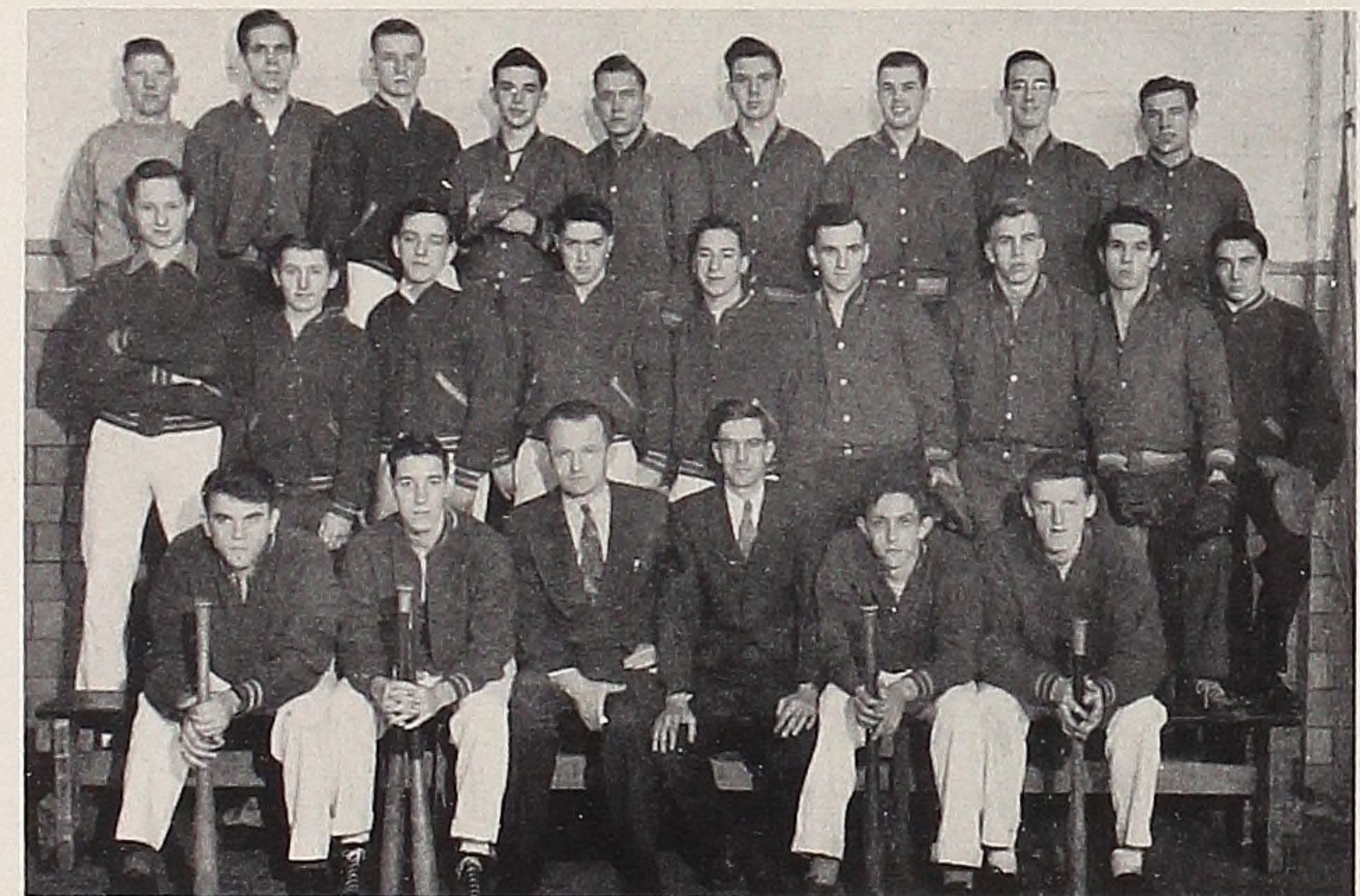
College Varsity Basketball
